**"GROW TO GIVE: GIVE TO GROW!"**

is the focus for our 2017 Stewardship Season. Let's take that phrase apart for a bit...

**"GIVE"**—Scripture is very clear that we give, first of all, *because we have received*:

We have been given forgiveness, new and eternal life in the Gift of Jesus Christ (Romans 6:23).

We have been given the Gift & gifts of the Holy Spirit to share & grow as the body of Christ  
(1 Cor. 12:4).

We have been given the very resources of heaven and earth to "fuel" the Gospel's mission  
(Ps. 50:10).

We have been given all things to do what God says to do with His gifts to give Him the greatest  
glory in Christ! (1 Cor. 10:31).

**"TO"**—God gives us His *gifts to accomplish His will*:

We are stewards of God's gifts: we manage His resources according to His Word and plan  
(1 Pet. 4:10).

We are partners with God and His people, the Church, all over the world: our surpluses and  
especially our sacrificial giving encourages and provides for other parts of the body of Christ  
to grow too (2 Cor. 8:1ff).

We are investors with God in His coming Kingdom: we are to use temporal resources to make an  
eternal difference in the lives and destination (i.e., heaven) of others (Matt. 6:33).

**"GROW"**—God expects a *return on His investments* in and through us:

We should give faithfully, out of joy and love, because we show the world who Jesus is in our  
giving (2 Cor. 9:7).

We should give sacrificially, beginning with the tithe, because we declare God's worth in our  
giving, and so invite others to Christ (Malachi 3:10).

We should give expectantly, looking for *God-sized* results-- a bountiful harvest of souls brought to  
Christ as well as spiritual growth of those who give--as God will multiply our gifts beyond what  
we or the gifts are capable of doing, and so God gets all the glory (2 Cor. 9:10).

## SESSION DIGEST



The Session met on September 27, 2016 for a regular monthly stated meeting. Elder Odom shared a devotional about how God supplies the needs of those who trust Him from 1 Kings 17:2-4. Shirley McLeod was introduced as the new Director of the Sonrise Pre-School. She shared about how God called her to serve Him at Pasadena Pre-School, about her family, about the faculty and the beginning of school, and about how excited she was to be here. The Session then gathered around her to pray for her, the school, and for her family.

The Session discussed and/or acted on the following items during the remainder of the meeting.

Elder Gene Hammond was authorized to retain a real estate attorney for the purpose of investigating and subdividing the property along Burlington Avenue. Funding will come out of the General Reserve Money Market Account.

Pastor Crawford was authorized to retain Drew Crawford of Boswell & Dunlap in Bartow for reincorporating Pasadena Presbyterian Church.

The contract for custodial services with Florida Maintenance will be terminated and a contract with Housecleaning by Vicki, Inc. for up to twenty hours per week effective November 1, 2016.

ECO requires an application with Pasadena Presbyterian Church. That application has been developed with the appropriate answers. It was moved and seconded to approve and send the completed application for membership in ECO.

A letter about becoming a charter covenant partner will be sent to the active roll members of Pasadena Presbyterian Church will be mailed after November 17, 2016.

Reverend Gary Hofmeyer of ECO will be invited to conduct ECO training classes for anyone interested during eight weeks from January 8, 2017, during the Sunday morning Breakfast with Jesus class in the Fellowship Hall from 8:30 a.m. to 9:45 a.m.

November 13, 2016 was approved as Pledge Sunday with the theme, "Give to Grow".

## FOOD DISTRIBUTION MINISTRY REPORT SEPTEMBER 2016

451 Households, 1207 individuals, 10,735 pounds of food given out

I am amazed what God continues to do in the lives of people through your Food Distribution Center. We have seen the power of God change the lives of people who come to visit us every month. Some of them have been healed, others have been helped. We see the smiles on faces of both men and women who were at one time distraught.

One man asked for prayer two weeks ago and came back last Saturday. He thought he was going to die of cancer. He had a negative test.

A mother of four continues to tell us that if it wasn't for the food she receives from your church, both she and her husband would not be able to make it, even with two jobs. It would be food or housing, not both.

The above lady has a daughter who came to us and received Jesus. She is a teenager, and has dreams of becoming a paramedic some day. She had been told she wasn't smart enough. She is getting good grades and dreams of helping others.

Lives are changed and people continue to thank us and we convey their thanks to you.



### Evangelmissions

The heavens open and the angels sing when we say YES to the Lord.  
**Luke 14:23 "Then the master told his servant, 'Go out to the roads and country lanes and compel them to come in, so that my house will be full.'"** Through Faith Promise our church gives prayer and financial support to Living Bread International Church. Apostle and Director Karen Dunham loves God and knows He is the God of the helpless and the hopeless who can change any life into a pure stream of praise to Him.

In 2003. She was told by a Jerusalem priest, "if you will feed these people [meaning the Palestinian refugees], 'You can encourage them to return to God.'" Against much oppression and advice Karen and her son Blake attempted to obtain housing in the city of Jericho where no one would rent to them. Later, they found one who would rent a house to them in a Palestinian refugee camp. So they moved inside the refugee camp. Karen and her son began distributing sacks of rice, along with Full bibles. They began small meetings to teach the Bible in her home, which grew to large weekly church services outside to hold the crowds. The Palestinians had never really heard the story of Israel and why they were in the land. They were fascinated with what the Bible had to say about the places around the city- they saw daily. Karen and her son received several death threats during this time...those coming to the weekly teachings had rocks thrown at them and were persecuted. They were bombed out of three separate homes, as well as, Karen's car was blown up. They stayed and continued to help the poor, Gods love for the people told them no matter what happened they must stay and as a result planted many home educational centers learning about grace, peace, and truth.

In July of 2007 Living Bread relocated their "corporate headquarters" from Jericho to Jerusalem, accepting an NGO\* status to duplicate the work that they were doing in Jericho in all 27 refugee camps. This was a huge door opening for Living Bread and the poor. They are now meeting with liaison officers and bringing education and aid in many cities and camps.

A broadcasting company took note of the "revival" that was occurring in Jericho and approached Karen a few years ago, suggesting that she begin a weekly television program. From that came the birth of the **Door of Hope** television broadcast, which was broadcast to 133 nations within the 10-40 window, as well as, in Israel, West Bank, Australia, America and Europe. Pastor Karen knows the promise of God will always come for you. He promised and it will happen, even if the promise comes for you inside a refugee camp. Living Bread is in many reconciliation projects throughout the land and keeps an office in Gaza, Jerusalem and Jericho. In United States the office is located in Cantonment Florida.





**PRAISE KIDS CLUB AND YOUTH GROUP OFFER TIME FOR KIDS AND YOUTH TO STUDY THE BIBLE**

**We're teaching the Bible on Sunday nights to kids three and up (and giving parents a little time for themselves!) We teach the truths of the Bible through stories, games and crafts to the elementary and for older kids and those who have graduated, a discussion time.**

**At 6 p.m. we offer a snack and time to gather and get to know each other. Then we break into groups to learn about Jesus. Even the kids in the nursery get an age-appropriate lesson.**

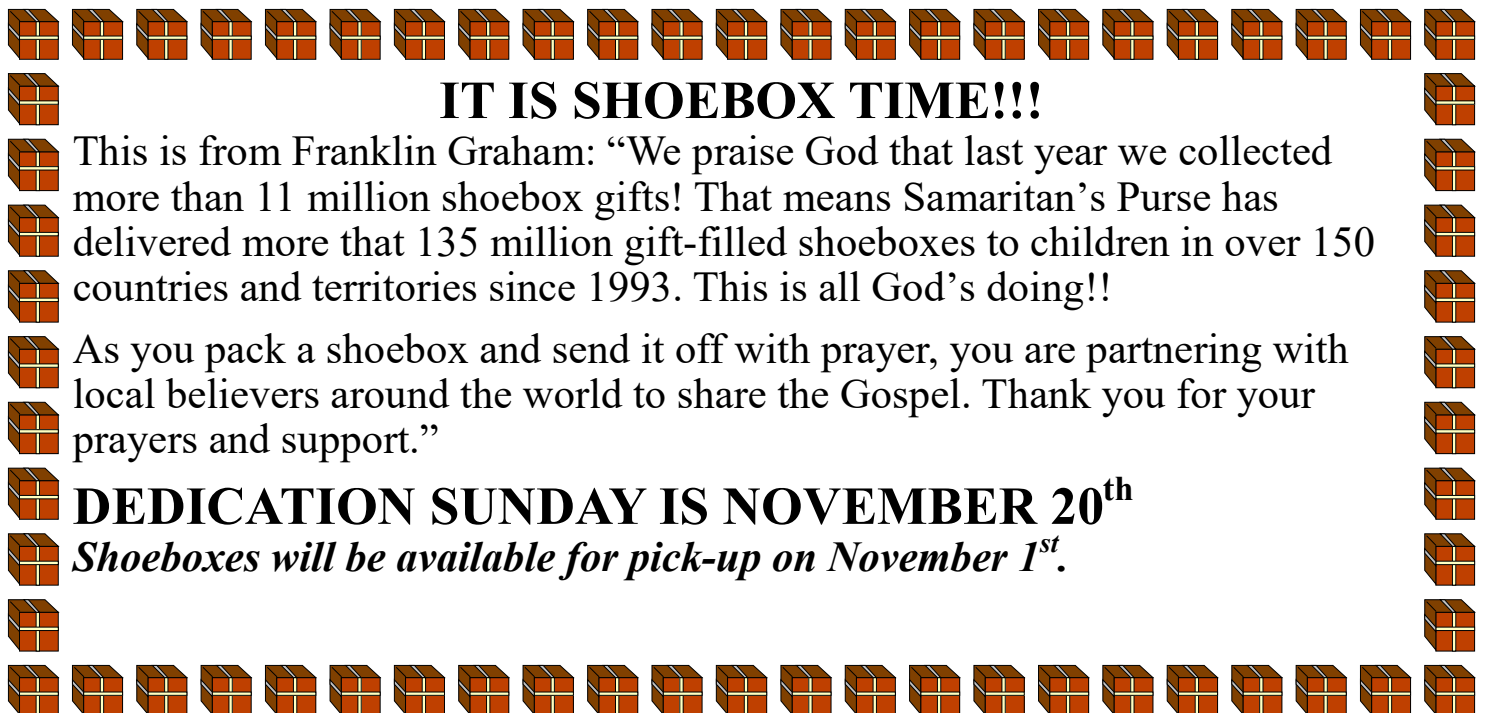
Other possible activities were discussed but nothing planned as of this writing. We are looking forward to work with the preschool in different activities and will keep you updated on upcoming events.

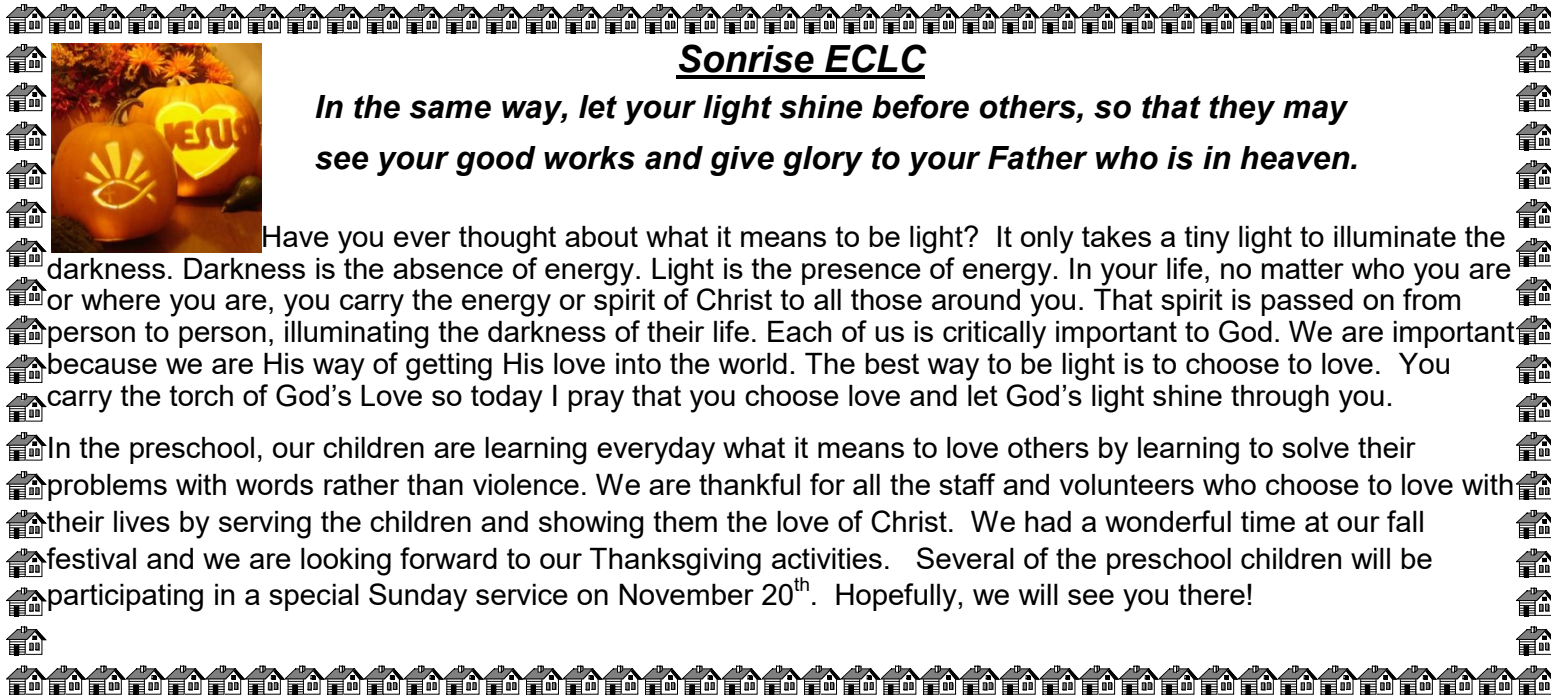
## IT IS SHOEBOX TIME!!!

## **Library News**



### **READING TRENDS DIFFER, DEPENDING ON GENDER AND CHRISTIAN STATUS**



When Americans read for something other than work or school, they prefer fiction (53%) rather than nonfiction (45%), according to a recent Barna Group survey, Christianity Today reported in May 2016 (<http://www.christianitytoday.com/gleanings/2016/may/will-christians-read-beth-moore-first-novel-saint-silvanus.html>). However, practicing Christians want nonfiction Christian books (35%) (rather) than fiction Christian books (18%).

CT continues: "Women read more than men—...and about twice as many women as men reach for Christian books, according to Barna."

Although Christian fiction had been in a buying slump, sales were increasing. Religious presses sold 4.2% more in January 2016 than January 2015, according to statistics gathered by the Association of American Publishers (AAP).

AAP also reported that adult (secular) books sales went down 12.9% in the same period and childrens/ young adult were down 20.4%. This was reported in the AAP June 27, 2016. <http://newsroom.publishers.org/publishers-sales-down-at-the-start-of-2016-ebooks-decline>

in the last five years, Bible and religious nonfiction sales are up 53%, Jonathan Nowell of Nielsen Books reports." While the previous five years had only 9% increase.

In case you were wondering, ebooks were down 24.9% in the January 2015-2016 time period. Even though paperback books grew 4.3%, the sales of all books were down 6.7%. AAP doesn't offer any reasons for the declines. "Despite the advance of the digital age, 7 out of 10 adults still prefer a physical book, and they get their books most often from brick-and-mortar stores (33%) or from the library (24%)," CT writes.

Whether you want Christian fiction or nonfiction, come to your church library.

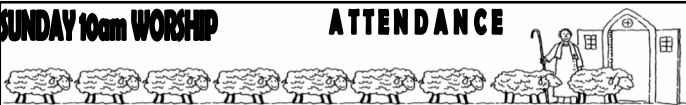
