Gospel News Flash February 2021



Evangelizing our friends and family

Next Month on Sunday March 7th we celebrate our missionaries and our partnership with them in sharing the gospel throughout the world. We should be active throughout the year in our partnership with our missionaries but what is our responsibility to our friends and family?

At some point, every Christian has had a family member, a friend, coworker, or acquaintance who is not a Christian. Sharing the gospel with others can be difficult, and it can become even more difficult when it involves someone with whom we have close emotional ties. The Bible tells us that some people will be offended at the gospel (Luke 12:51-53). However, we are commanded to share the gospel, and there is no excuse for not doing so (Matthew 28:19-20; Acts 1:8; 1 Peter 3:15).

So, how can we evangelize our family members, friends, co-workers, and acquaintances? The most important thing we can do is pray for. Pray that God would change their hearts and open their eyes to the truth of the gospel (2 Corinthians 4:4). Pray that God would convince them of His love for them and their need for salvation through Jesus Christ (John 3:16). Pray for wisdom as to how to best minister to them (James 1:5).

We must be willing and bold in our actual sharing of the gospel. Proclaim the message of salvation through Jesus Christ to your friends and family (Romans 10:9-10)). Always be prepared to speak of your faith (1 Peter 3:15), doing so with gentleness and respect. There is no substitute for personally sharing the gospel: "Faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ" (Romans 10:17).

In addition to praying and sharing our faith, we must also live godly Christian lives in front of our friends and family members so they can see the change God has made in us (Peter 3:1-2). Ultimately, we must leave the salvation of our loved ones up to God. It is God's power and grace that saves people, not our efforts. The best we can do is pray for them, witness to them, and live the Christian life in front of them. It is God who gives the increase (1 Corinthians 3:6).

SESSION DIGEST

The Session met for a stated meeting on December 22, 2020. Below are items that were discussed, and the actions taken.

- 1. Distributed new Covenant Partner zones and agreed to a process where Elders notify Pastor Eric when our Covenant Partners have a need for pastoral care.
- 2. Unanimously approved a 2021 budget with a funding deficit of 8.3% (or \$27,000). The Elders expressed confidence in the work that God is doing at our church and that we are excited to see how He will provide for His work at New Creation Family Church. We believe God will provide as our church continues to grow. Our plan to be good stewards of God's resources includes closely monitoring our expenses and giving in early 2021 and make adjustments if needed. We also agreed to communicate the deficit funding to the congregation so that those who are able and led to increase their giving are made aware of the need.
- 3. Agreed to delay January Communion until January 10, 2021 (second Sunday in January)



MISSION & OUTREACH MINISTRY

March 7 is Missions and Faith Promise Sunday

It is good to remember Jesus' words in Matthew 28:18-20: "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you: and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Jesus emphasized four things in this passage, the first being His power and authority. Take note of Jesus' words: "All authority has been given to *Me*, therefore *you* go." The implication is clear: As we go with His message, we'll have His power. Jesus made this even clearer in Acts 1:8, saying, "You shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me."

This is great comfort in witnessing. In our preaching or personal conversation, we may think we've failed. But the Holy Spirit has a way of using some word or verse, for the *power* isn't in your personality or intellect, or in your skills of persuasion. It's in His Spirit-anointed Word, and His Word doesn't return void.

Having reminded us of His power, Jesus then stated His purpose for the church—to "make disciples of all the nations." The word *disciple* means "a follower, learner, one who adheres to a leader and teacher." We're involved in disciple-making every day on a local level as people watch our lives and see Christ in us. Something as simple as writing a Bible verse in a greeting card or distributing a tract is part of fulfilling the Great Commission.

But notice those words "all nations." It's a global task. Jesus wants us to reach the world, and it takes the church to accomplish this. The main purpose is to make disciples, but the process is by going, baptizing, and teaching.

Jesus ends the Great Commission by assuring us of His presence. As we draw on His power, adopt His purpose, and implement His plan, we'll enjoy His presence: "I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Jesus tells us that as we are going out to the world, He'll be with us always. If God has called you to be a missionary, don't be afraid to say, "Yes!" Commit to pray earnestly and daily for missionaries as they serve. Discover how your church is involved in global ministries and get involved.

And as you gather week by week in the safe and comfortable community of our own congregation, remember that it's a blessed home, it's a place for rest, of refreshing and rejoicing, and of growth. But the Great Commission isn't an "inside job." We're called to go, and we gather inside the gates only to prepare to venture beyond them for Jesus and His Kingdom.

Missions and Faith Promise Sunday is March 7th. Don't forget to pray about how you can make disciples, pray for our missionaries and make a Faith Promise to support them. Maybe this year to go visit one or more of our missionaries in their mission field. But don't forget that you have a mission field of your own.

WOMEN OF THE CHURCH - FEBRUARY, 2021


