1. Approved the new PPC Purpose Statement below:

Our mission is to proclaim the eternal gospel of the kingdom of God and its King, the Lord Jesus Christ, which is given by grace, received through faith, and lived out in love by the power of the Holy Spirit.

2. Discussed a proposed new ministry structure, including the creation of a Finance ministry.

3. Approved manse renovations for an estimated cost of \$46,000.

4. Approved the use of the sanctuary by 40 Days of Life for their kickoff on September 22 at 7 p.m.

Looking at some of the outstanding Christian writers who gave us their thoughts in books, talks and sermons can be beneficial, especially in times such as we are having. Here are two of my favorites. You have your own outstanding communicators who you like. Here are two of mine and a bit of what each wrote:

C.S. Lewis: "The Christian doctrine of suffering explains, I believe, a very curious fact about the world we live in. The settled happiness and security which we all desire, God withholds from us by the very nature of the world: but joy, pleasure, and merriment, He has scattered broadcast. We are never safe, but we have plenty of fun, and some ecstasy. It is not hard to see why. The security we crave would teach us to rest our hearts in this world and oppose an obstacle to our return to God: a few moments of happy love, a landscape, a symphony, a merry meeting with our friends, a bathe or a football match, have no such tendency. Our Father refreshes us on the journey with some pleasant inns, but will not encourage us to mistake them for home."

Charles R. Swindoll:

"Wonderful, comforting thought: We and He are supernaturally interwoven and inseparable. Wherever you or I go, He goes. Whatever we think, He knows, In fact, He oversaw our conception and He gave us our personality as well as our physical makeup." (in *Flying Closer to the Flame*, speaks of Psalm 139:7-10)


I do have a special request. We need a special volunteer who can lovingly organize and manage the cars in the parking lot on distribution day. :)

EVANGELISM & MISSIONS

If you are not aware of this, you should know that God has blessed the Pasadena Presbyterian food distribution ministry to be a shining bright light in this midst of this coronavirus. When you see God moving it's a really good idea to start moving along with what he is doing.

I don't just mean serving with the food distribution, although that would be a great thing in itself and you would witness firsthand the powerful way God can use ordinary people to do extraordinary things. I mean see what they are doing for those we serve and develop ways to do it with those you come into contact.

There is a lot of work that goes into picking up food, and stocking the shelves each week and preparing the bags, produce, dairy & frozen meat for the monthly food distribution. There are also prayer warriors who call and follow up with those having physical and mental health issues, sickness and deaths in the family and more and there are those who give financial support. Even this is an opportunity to see God's hand at work in the lives of those serving that sacrifice their personal time for the sake of others and how God blesses that with fellowship, and love for each other. Don't get me wrong, we have some wonderful talented and giving people in this ministry but when you see it all come together, you just know that there is no way this great thing could happen without God being in the middle of it.

So, what do we do in the middle of a pandemic? Perhaps join Larry and Alma Oline in the Thursday night prayer meeting on zoom. I think we will see much come of this weekly prayer meeting if we will support it with our attendance and prayers. So, what should we pray for? I read this from Chris Brown of North Coast Church in Vista, California and it seemed to be the right thing for us to do.

LET'S PRAY MORE FOR OUR MINISTRY THAN OUR MISERY

I am not saying to stop praying for God to take this misery away. I am not super spiritual—when there is misery in my life, I ask God to take it away. But we need to pray more for our ministry, that we would be light during this time. I don't like going through trials, but they shouldn't stop our ministry. When do you see the light better, outside in the daylight or at night? It is the same light no matter what time it is, but you will see the light in the darkness in amazing ways.

We need to have a kingdom dream that says, God, it's not about the quality of my life anymore; it's how I glorify you. And if I shine brighter in dark times, I will pray for darkness to end, but I will pray more for my ministry.

If we redefine the "good life" as simply glorifying God, then life will never be bad. But if we define it as health, wealth and prosperity, most of us won't have a good life during this time. If our definition of good life is "I get to glorify God," I promise you this season won't be bad. In fact, it might be one of the best seasons we've ever been through. We can shine, and people will note that we've been with Jesus.

And this from Dave Ferguson Community Christian Church, Chicago

Shift 1: Focus on the needs of the community, not the church.

Shift 2: Focus on external care, not internal programs. We put all this under the branding of "COMMUNITY Cares" and began to boldly challenge our people to be the church by showing that Community cares.

Perhaps this is our greatest opportunity to mobilize our people for Jesus' mission.
